Presented an update on the District Continuous Improvement plan. This CIP is presented under the State's new MICIP model. Data that was collected in fall of 2022 is being used to reflect on and assess student needs and next steps. The planned approach to positively impacting growth in needed areas include summer extension opportunities, increased SEL support, expansion of SEL coaches, early literacy training and culturally responsive instruction. The primary focus is geared toward academics specifically in reading and math. The collected data was reviewed for both areas of math and reading and then supports were highlighted for each which included professional development, shifting practices and expanding resources to support all learners.
