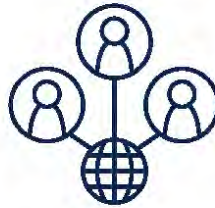

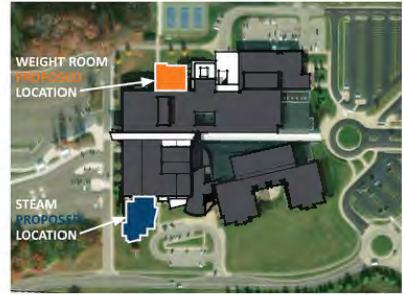
2022 BOND

In November 2022, our community voted YES to support the 2022 Saline Area Schools bond proposal, which will provide \$180,000,000 for building & site improvements to address identified facility needs. The 2022 bond millage resulted in a net tax rate decrease of 0.50 mills on summer 2023 taxes.

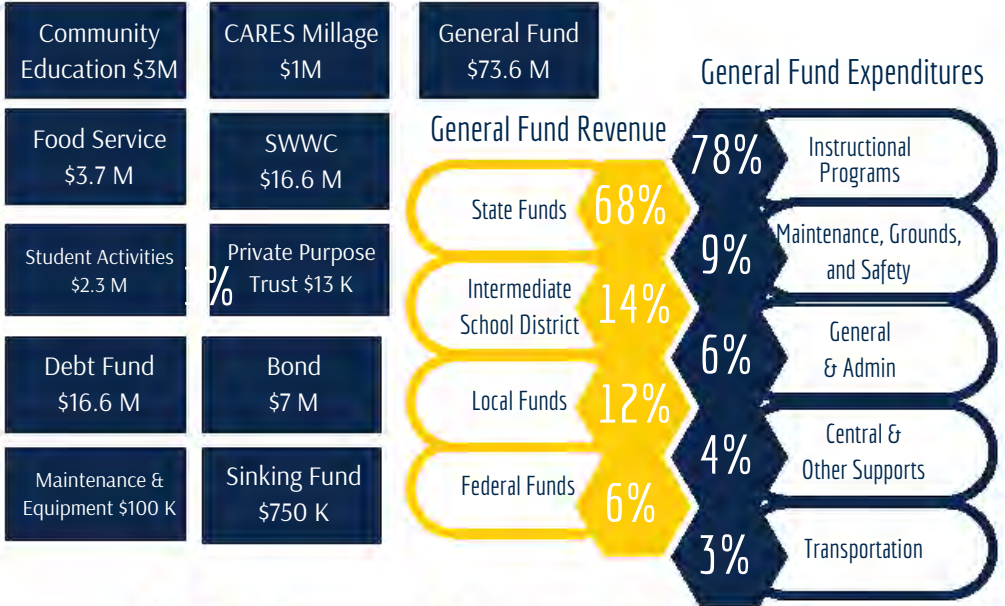

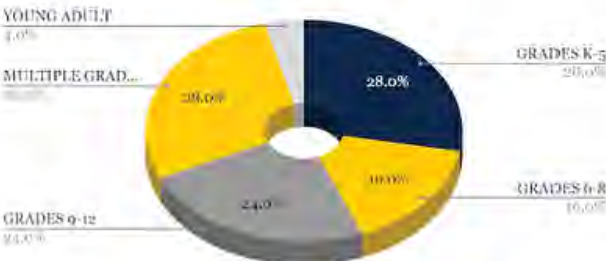
