Hospitality & Tourism Management Syllabus

Course Description: This program, located at Dexter High School, focuses on lodging, food and beverage operations, tourism, attractions and travel, and event management. This CTE program introduces students to various aspects of hospitality and tourism-related careers within the industry. This course presents students with career readiness and position-specific skills as they consider post-secondary plans for college and career. To be successful, students in the Hospitality & Tourism program need to be present through exemplary attendance and engage with content, curriculum, and educational applications inside and outside of the classroom. Students must have a desire to learn and exhibit a strong skill set to be organized, detail-oriented, and excel with various forms of communication. Students will have the opportunity to earn the industry-recognized Hospitality and Tourism Specialist Credential.

General Information: This course exposes students to a variety of workplace and organizational environments. As we partner with community businesses and organizations, it is important that these partnerships are diverse and provide opportunities for students to learn through mirrors, windows, and sliding doors. CTE courses provide meaningful learning experiences, inside and outside of the classroom, empowering and preparing all learners for career pathways and opportunities.

Academic Credits: Math/4th Year, Visual, Performing & Applied Arts (VPAA), and World Language

Post-secondary connections: The SWWC - WCC Secondary/Post-Secondary Articulation Agreement outlines articulation with the program. In addition, WCC representatives communicate to students the opportunities for certifications pertaining to Business through WCC. These certifications are in addition to degree-attainment opportunities available to those interested in the Business career cluster, including Hospitality & Tourism Management. WCC has implemented a strategic manner in which WCC offers scaffolded approaches to certification, credentials, and degrees.

Work-Based Learning: Mrs. Mary Visel is the SWWC Work-Based Learning (WBL) Coordinator and will assist the program and the students served with varying levels of the WBL Continuum.

Safety Training: In addition to specific industry-recognized safety training, PASSES Safety Training is delivered to all SWWC students at the beginning of each year.

Student Leadership/CTSO opportunities: BPA is a natural extension to the program - <u>Business Professionals of America</u> (BPA) is a Career Technical Student Organization (CTSO) recognized throughout the state of Michigan and the United States.
